Call to Order

Meeting was called to order at 18:00 by Kenneth Barber

Approval of previous Minutes

May's minutes were approved. – Motion: Kenneth, 2nd: Kelly, Passed unanimous

Public Works / Well

- Kenneth: We need a plow truck and 2 plows at \$8.5k each. The vehicle should be a crew cab with less than 80k miles on it. The capital budget line stands at \$72k available funds.
 - Motion: Eric Authorize \$60,000 to procure 2x plows and a gaspowered crew truck, installation in Denver. 2nd: Chris, Passed unanimous
- A new motor grader will be needed soon, so explore different lease to purchase options. Kelly to determine how many more payments are needed to pay off the roller.
- Carey: New computer available, but cannot get into email.
- Getting quotes for new asphalt at the highway approaches
- Hurt Bridge has a tunneling pocket that looks like it may be undermining the bridge supports.
 - Contact County Road & Bridge and try to get Mike Torres to get an up-to-date inspection and a plan for correcting the problem
- The work of 6 people using \$800 in smoke bombs over two days had some effect on prairie dogs, but not 100% kill, for sure.
- Need to use the weed-eater around the perimeter of the park, also need to add a pesticide as there are fleas & ticks in the wood chips.
 - **Motion**: Kenneth Authorize \$400 to procure an industrial weedeater. 2nd: Eric, Passed unanimous
- Will be renting a mower from SWAG to clean up the greenbelt areas.
- Eric: Still need a Project Specification sheet developed for the Buttercup water tank re-coating.
- Pam: Century Link working on documentation for their claim of cable damage.
